(Sonoma County, CA) — Sonoma State University's Green Music Center brings the 2015/16 Season to a close with 16 diverse performances throughout the months of April and May in both the stunning 1,400-seat Weill Hall and the intimate 240-seat Schroeder Hall. The 2015/16 Season concludes on May 14 and the Summer 2016 Season in Weill Hall + Lawn will begin on July 4, 2016. Details of both the Summer 2016 Season and GMC ChamberFest 2016 will be announced shortly.

The MasterCard Performance Series in Weill Hall begins the month of April with iconic pianist André Watts (Apr. 1) in a program of Schubert, Chopin and Liszt. Six musicians from The Chamber Music Society of Lincoln Center (Apr. 8), including society Co-Artistic Director David Finckel, present their

"Glorious Sextets" program featuring sextets for strings by R. Strauss, Dvořák and Brahms. Bay Area "orchestra of voices" **Chanticleer** (Apr. 15) performs their varied "Over the Moon" program featuring music spanning from Monteverdi and Josquin Desprez to Nico Muhly and Mason Bates. Famed Indian sitar player **Anoushka Shankar** (Apr. 16) brings compositions from her album *Land of Gold*, inspired by the trauma and injustice experienced by refugees and victims of war.

Two giants of their respected fields—jazz pianist **Chick Corea** and bluegrass banjo player **Béla Fleck** (Apr. 21)—unite for a North American tour celebrating their recently released duo album *Two*. The album features dynamic live recordings of the two performing together over the span of several years.

Famed violinist **Midori** (Apr. 23) makes her Weill Hall debut with a program of Bach, Schubert, Brahms and Tchaikovsky. Eminent German baritone and respected expert in the lieder repertoire, **Matthias Goerne** (Apr. 24) performs Schubert's achingly beautiful song cycle *Die Schöne Müllerin* (*The Lovely Maid of the Mill*). Chinese-born pianist **Yuja Wang** (May 6)—making waves around the globe for her technical brilliance and interpretive insight—returns to Weill Hall for a solo recital featuring works by Brahms, Schumann and Beethoven.

The final concert in the 2015/16 MasterCard Performance Series in Weill Hall is San Francisco-based **Philharmonia Baroque Orchestra** (May 14) with conductor **Nicholas McGegan**, mezzo-soprano **Anne Sofie Von Otter** and countertenor **Andreas Scholl** performing a dynamic program of arias and duets from the operas and oratorios of Handel and a newly arranged work by Arvo Pärt.

On-Campus Presents (OCP), a programming series that promotes co-curricular and student life events for Sonoma State University students, presents two events as a part of the Women in Leadership Lecture Series. Young social entrepreneur Miki Agrawal (Apr. 13) presents "Do Cool Sh*t," named after her #1 Amazon bestseller, Do Cool Sh*t: Quit Your Day Job, Start Your Own Business, and Live Happily Ever After. Filmmaker and advocate Jennifer Siebel Newsom (Apr. 25) presents "Redefining Leadership." Newsom passionately uses film as a catalyst for cultural transformation, encouraging everyone, regardless of gender, race, class, age, sexual orientation or circumstance, to fulfill their human potential. Stand-up comedian, writer and actor, Nick Swardson (Apr. 26) is known for both is live performances and his recurring role as Terry Bernadino in the comedy series Reno 911!. Swardson completes this season's OCP series of concerts, lectures and comedy events.

The popular Sundays at Schroeder series in Schroeder Hall concludes with two performances perfectly suited to that unique venue. Organist James David Christie (Apr. 17), who performed in the hall's inaugural season, returns to perform a program of works by Böhm, Storace, de Macque, Gherardeschi, Buxtehude, Reincken, Piroye and Bach on Schroeder Hall's magnificent Brombaugh Opus 9 organ.

Margaret Leng Tan (May 1), the undisputed "queen of the toy piano," performs a program titled "Ode to Schroeder" on the toy piano and other toy instruments. The inaugural Schroeder Cabaret series comes to a close with Bay Area favorite, jazz singer Paula West (Apr. 30) in a program of jazz standards and cabaret classics.
